Who are we? What do we do?

We set up our charity in 1992 to support a school for destitute children in Orissa (now known as Odisha), India's poorest state. We fund a boarding school for some 300 girls who have been abandoned by their families, or are from prostitutes' and leprosy colonies, and other disadvantaged groups. We also support several teams of social workers who rescue runaway and abandoned children from the railways in Odisha and help them to return home or otherwise to find safety. We do this by fund-raising events, circulars to regular and potential supporters and in other ways.

Committee members and other supporters visit Odisha regularly on other work, and other expenses are covered by in-kind donations. We produce a newsletter for our supporters about four times a year. These newsletters, and other information, are on our website.

Cost-effective giving!

£240 a year, or £20 a month, pays for full-time boarding education for a girl who would otherwise be condemned to leprosy, begging, child labour, prostitution, or whatever other form of poverty it was born into. Or, £40 covers the cost of rescuing a child from living on the railway and reuniting him or her with family or finding other safe accommodation.
